File Format

Word or Google Docs should be used for all submissions. Although less preferred, PDF documents are still acceptable. Only in rare cases—and with hesitation—will alternative formats be taken into consideration. (For example, an MP3 podcast file).

Bio

We would like you to include a one- to two-sentence, third-person, biographical statement with each entry. It may consist of your age, interests, and any associated institutions (research institutes, schools, etc.). An example from the New York Times is shown below.

Language

It is required that all entries be made in English. We regret that the content of articles submitted in other languages cannot be reviewed by our editorial staff. Translations are welcome and accepted.

A submission must be succinct in order to be accepted. Submissions that are excessively wordy will go through a rigorous editing procedure that involves both writers and editors.

Title

All contributions must be submitted in English. We regret that our editorial staff is unable to review the content of articles submitted in other languages. We accept and welcome translations.

For a submission to be accepted, it must be brief. Overly wordy submissions will undergo a thorough editing process that includes editors and writers.

Tables and Figures

All entries have to be made in English. We are sorry, but articles submitted in other languages cannot be reviewed by our editorial staff. Translations are welcomed and accepted.

A submission needs to be concise in order to be accepted. Submissions that are excessively wordy will go through a rigorous editing process involving writers and editors.

References and Citations

All information sources must be rigorously cited. Any text derived from research or other works must be properly attributed. Failure to do so will result in the immediate rejection of the article. The YGS editorial team treats plagiarism, whether intentional or accidental, with utmost seriousness.

For Science submissions, all references should follow the Vancouver style. Most citation tools (e.g., Cite This for Me, Zotero) support Vancouver style. Click [here](#) for a guide by Monash University, Australia, on how to cite in this style.

For Social Science and Arts submissions, all references should use the Chicago style. Most citation tools (e.g., Cite This for Me, Zotero) support Chicago style. [Click here for a guide](#). For these submissions, we prefer all references to be included as footnotes rather than in-line to maintain the article's flow.
